### **Birth and Death Certificates**

#### **BENEFITS:**

The Department of Health's Division of Vital Records maintains records of Pennsylvania births and deaths from 1906 to the present. You may need certified copies of birth certificates for passport, Social Security or other benefits, employment, and personal identification; you or your family may need certified copies of death certificates for estate purposes, inheritance, and genealogy research. Certified copies of birth certificates (with a raised seal) are issued for a fee of \$20 and acceptable for various uses, such as personal identification, employment, passport application, and Social Security. Certified copies of death certificates (with a raised seal) are issued for a fee of \$9 and acceptable for various uses, such as settling an estate, insurance, pension/ retirement, property transfer, Social Security, and stock/bonds. The fees may be waived for Armed Forces members (active or retired), the legal spouse of said Armed Forces members, and the dependent child of Armed Forces members (documentation may be required). You may order certified copies of birth and death certificates online at http://www.health. pa.gov/MyRecords/, at one of the Vital Records public offices, through the mail, or through your local Pennsylvania legislator. 

## Grapefruit-Beet-GoatCheese Flatbread



#### Ingredients

- 1 1/2 pounds golden beets
- 1 pound bakery pizza dough
- Vegetable cooking spray
- 1/2 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 6 ounces goat cheese, crumbled
- 2 small grapefruit, peeled and sectioned
- 2 tablespoons fresh mint leaves, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup toasted pine nuts
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 1/4 teaspoon coarse sea salt

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Trim beet stems to 1 inch; gently wash beets, and place in a 13- x 9-inch baking dish. Add 1/3 cup water, and cover with aluminum foil.
- 2. Bake at 350° for 1 hour or until tender. Uncover and cool completely (about 30 minutes).
- 3. Meanwhile, remove pizza dough from refrigerator, and let stand 30 minutes.
- 4. Increase oven temperature to 425°. Turn dough out on a lightly floured surface, and roll into a 17x 13-inch rectangle (about 1/4 inch thick). Place dough rectangle on a lightly greased (with cooking spray) baking sheet.
- 5. Brush dough with olive oil; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Bake at 425° for 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown.
- 6. Cut cooled beets into thin slices. Top crust with beet slices, goat cheese, grapefruit segments, sliced mint, and toasted pine nuts, leaving a 1/2-inch border. Drizzle flatbread with honey, and sprinkle with sea salt.





## **Dementia Live Experience**



Dementia is a general term for a decline in mental ability severe enough to interfere with daily life. Memory loss is an example. Alzheimer's is the most common type of dementia. Recently the Jefferson County Area Agency on Aging (JCAAA) hosted a unique experience for caregivers, providers, and social workers to learn more about dementia. The Dementia Live<sup>TM</sup> Experience program was offered on November 9th at the Heritage House in Brookville. While we can never experience what it is like to live with dementia, the AGEucate Training Institute® has developed the Dementia Live<sup>TM</sup> Experience. This high impact experience takes participants on an immersive journey into the life of someone living with dementia.

Facilitated by certified trainers from the PA Behavioral Health and Aging Coalition, participants were guided through the Dementia Live training program and gained a better understanding of the daily struggles those living with dementia face. By experiencing the sensory changes and cognitive impairment participants developed a deeper understanding and heightened empathy for those living with dementia. This awareness helps build new bridges of communication leading to better communication and enhanced person-centered care.

Those that participated shared that this experience gave them a different perspective on how to interact with someone with dementia and gave them tools to better communicate as a result.

Special thanks to the instructors; Deborah Allen and Anne Adams from the PA Behavioral Health and Aging Coalition. We also thank the staff of JCAAA for participating. The PA Link program provided the funding for this learning experience.


