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Medicare Annual Open Enrollment

October 15, 2018 - December 7, 2018

The Medicare Annual Open Enrollment Period for 2018 will be from October 15 to December 7. During this period each year, Medicare beneficiaries can join, switch or drop their Medicare Part D or Medicare Advantage coverage.

Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage plans change the coverage and costs each year, so it is important to review your plan and compare it to others on the market that are available to Jefferson County residents.

APPRISE, a free health insurance counseling program for Medicare beneficiaries residing in Pennsylvania, will have counselors available during the entire Annual Open Enrollment Period. These unbiased and friendly counselors will help you understand your options in comparing Part D and Medicare Advantage plans at the following events in the community. This counseling is free.



Benefits & Rights RESTRICTED LICENSE

Benefits: People who do not meet the vision standards for a driver's license may qualify for a restricted (low vision) license. A restricted license allows the driver to drive during daylight hours on roadways other than freeways.

Those Eligible: A person with visual acuity of less than 20/70 combined vision, but at least 20/100 combined vision with best correction and 120 degrees field vision in the horizontal meridian may qualify (with a recommendation from an optometrist or physician).

What is The Options PERS Program?

Pennsylvania's Options Program provides aging state residents with care services in their homes such as personal care, home health and home delivered meals. Assistance is also provided to family caring for a loved one at home such as adult day care, respite care and transportation assistance.

The Options Program begins with a comprehensive assessment of the applicant's health and physical abilities. The assessment determines their care needs and presents different funding options based on their financial situation.

Personal Emergency Response Systems (PERS), also known as Medical Emergency Response Systems, let you call for help in an emergency by pushing a button. A PERS has three components: a small radio transmitter, a console connected to your landline telephone or cellular phone connection, and an emergency response center that monitors calls.

Transmitters are light-weight, battery-powered devices. You can wear one around your neck, on a wrist band, on a belt, or in your pocket. When you need help, you press the transmitter's help button, which sends a signal to the console. The console automatically dials one or more emergency telephone numbers. Most PERS are programmed to telephone an emergency response center. The center will try to find out the nature of your emergency. They also may review your medical history and check who should be notified.

Who is JCAAA?

Jefferson County Area Agency on Aging, Inc. is a private, charitable, non-profit corporation dedicated to providing a comprehensive array of the highest quality health and human services to residents of Jefferson County. We will accomplish this mission by committing to our guiding principles of Integrity, Coordinated Community Partnerships, Best Service, Progressive Attitudes, Professionalism, Teamwork and Investment in our Employees and Volunteers.

The Agency serves as the front door for the Pennsylvania Department of Aging services here at the local level. The AAA implements the various programs and services offered to older adults in Jefferson County; as the gateway to those available services.

The AAA offers needed assistance, supportive service, and advice. The Agency is staffed with workers skilled in various fields such as geriatrics, social work, and community resources. Areas in which the AAA assists include: providing care for an older relative; investigating reports of abuse and neglect; recommending social or educational opportunities; and much more. The Area Agency on Aging, Inc. acts as an advocate to keep older adults active and independent in their own communities.



Each year the Social Security Administration announces the annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA). Usually there is an increase in the Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefit amount people receive each month, starting the following January. By law, federal benefits increase when the cost of living rises, as measured by the Department of Labor's Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W).

The CPI-W rises when prices increase for the things the average consumer buys. This means that when prices for goods and services we purchase become more expensive, on average, the COLA increases monthly benefit levels and helps you keep up with the changing cost of living.

As a result, more than 67 million Americans will see a 2.8 percent increase in their Social Security and SSI benefits in 2019.

January 2019 marks other changes that will happen based on the increase in the national average wage index. For example, the maximum amount of earnings subject to Social Security payroll tax, as well as the retirement earnings test exempt amount, will change in 2019.

Want to know your new benefit amount as soon as possible? In December 2018, the Social Security Administration will post Social Security COLA notices online for retirement, survivors, and disability beneficiaries who have a my Social Security account. You will be able to view and save these COLA notices

securely via the Message Center inside my Social Security.

Be the first to know! Sign up for or log in to your personal my Social Security account today and choose email or text under "Message Center Preferences" to receive courtesy notifications so you won't miss your electronic COLA notice!

This year, you will still receive your COLA notice by mail. In the future, you will be able to choose whether you receive your notice online instead of on paper. Online notices will not be available to representative payees, individuals with foreign mailing addresses, or those who pay higher Medicare premiums due to their income. The Social Security Administration

plans to expand the availability of COLA notices to additional online customers in the future.




