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The Jefferson County Area Agency on Aging is aiming to continue helping the area's most vulnerable population with Grab & Go Emergency Kits. All 168 consumers currently receiving Home Delivered Meals through the Aging office recently received one of these home kits.

The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency created an Emergency Preparedness Guide which states "Emergency workers will help after a disaster strikes, but they may not be able to reach everyone right away. That's why it's so important to be ready to survive on your own for at least three days during an emergency. This may mean having another place to stay, extra food, water, first-aid and other basic needs. We can't control natural disasters, emergencies, or terrorist attacks, but we can be ready for them and know what to do to take care of ourselves and our loved ones." Molly McNutt, Executive Director of JCAAA, shares "our care managers speak with every one of our consumers about emergency preparedness and having a plan. By offering them one of these kits, instead of just a list of items they need, we are one step closer to ensuring our older adults are prepared in the event of an emergency".



Healthy Steps Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 10:30am Hello and welcome to another edition of the Senior Spotlight! I'd like to highlight another one of our amazing seniors of Jefferson County once again! Allow me to introduce you to Russell "Dick" Marshall. Dick is THE longtime locksmith of the Punxsutawney area and has been in this position ever since the 1970's. His service is called Punxsy Locksmith and when I went to his home in May and learned that he was the local (and really ONLY) locksmith around, I recognized Dick and told him that he has actually assisted me with getting back into my car and home on a few occasions! He told me that I looked familiar as well!

Dick came to be a locksmith while living and working in LaGrange, TX back in the 1960's as a ranch hand and oil rigger. Dick relocated to Texas in his early 20's due to not being able to find employment in the Punxsutawney area. He attended Locksmithing school in Austin, TX and became a certified locksmith after three months and was able to make his way back to PA. Dick told me that there have been a few very pressing incidents over the years with having to rescue toddlers in locked vehicles in the Summer heat due the children playing with the door locks. Dick has also been able to rescue pets from locked cars! At this point, Dick still

Another interesting fact about Dick is that he uses a converted mini school bus as his sole mode of transportation! Dick initially purchased a small school bus in order to haul his locksmithing equipment. He has since converted the school bus into a camper, complete with a bed, toilet, table with seating area, storage, refrigerator and gas stove! This is Dick's second bus and he recently purchased it at a nearby bus auction. He states that he enjoys camping very much in his bus and has already gone camping overnight in it this year and also has a 5-day camping trip planned at a local state park this Summer! The bus runs off of a diesel engine and gets about 30 miles per gallon according to Dick. It also has a wheelchair lift built-in for his motorized scooter. You can see a couple of pictures of both the inside and the outside of the bus here!




