On June 1st the JCAAA main office will begin a limited return towards eventual full operations of all the programs and services we provide for seniors in Jefferson County. The main office at 186 Main Street will accept in-person visitors by appointment only. To schedule an appointment please call us at 814-849-3096. We are following the CDC and State guidelines on reopening senior centers. Like other businesses, we have rules and procedures we must follow to ensure employee and participant safety. At this time, we won't be able to reopen the senior centers until July 1st.

We will continue to monitor the guidelines for approved capacity at our senior centers. This will mean that all those wishing to attend one of our centers must call the center in advance to reserve their desired attendance. Please understand that not everyone may be able to be accommodated each day. We will have curbside pick-up meals for those seniors who are unable to, or desire not to, attend a center for lunch while state and/or federal regulations permit us to do so.

Those who come to the center will be required to follow handwashing, mask wearing, and social distancing protocols. Those who are ill are asked not to attend and must understand that if they are visibly ill, their entrance will be denied. We will remain respectful of the older adults we serve, and their individual rights and preferences, while doing our best to offer a safe environment for them to meet and socialize while maintaining the safety of our staff and other participants.

Economic Impact Payments for Personal Care Home Residents

The Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act gives a one-time payment of \$1,200 to those with incomes less than \$75,000 per year and who are not a dependent on someone's tax return. For most, the payment is based on 2018 or 2019 tax returns, but you do not need to file taxes to get this money. All personal care home residents with a Social Security number may get this payment.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- This payment is <u>vour money</u> and DOES NOT have to be shared or given to the personal care home. You choose how to spend it!
- It is <u>not</u> counted as income so it will not change your Supplemental Security Income (SSI) eligibility.
- It is <u>not</u> counted as a resource for SSI eligibility for the next 12 months. But you must spend any money over the \$2,000 resource limit within the year!
- If you get Social Security you may have already gotten your payment but, if not, should get your money by the end of April. If you get SSI, you should get your money in May. If income from Veterans' benefits, the time is not clear yet as to when you will be paid.
- You get the one-time payment the same way you get your monthly income:
 - By direct deposit to your account at the personal care home, your personal account at your bank, or your Direct Express debit card
 - By paper check sent in the mail
 - Your representative payee or legal representative
- The IRS will mail a letter about your payment **to your last known address** within 15 days after your money is sent. The letter will say where your money was sent and how to report not getting your payment.
- Do not pay anyone to help you get your money. It is a scam!
- You can track your payment and verify information like your address online with "Get My Payment" at <u>https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/economic-impact-payments</u>. If needed, ask for help to connect to this website.

PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE APPLICATION DEADLINE EXTENDED

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, the deadline for older adults and Pennsylvania residents with disabilities to apply for rebates on rent and property taxes paid in 2019 has been extended from June 30 to Dec. 31, 2020



The Area Agency on Aging suspended the income tax preparation for the remainder of this year but we will still be available to help you with your <u>property tax and rent rebate application</u>. Once the senior centers are reopened for visitors you can schedule an appointment with the center director to have this completed. The deadline was extended to December 31, 2020.

Farmer Market Vouchers



The Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Program will be offered again this year to eligible Jefferson County Seniors. This program is made possible through the PA Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Food Distribution. Jefferson County Area Agency on Aging will be administering the program starting June 1, 2020. This program provides \$24.00 in vouchers free to eligible older adults (an increase of \$4 per person). The purpose is to encourage older consumers to eat more fresh fruits and vegetables by local growers who make their produce available at farmer's markets.

Health experts recommend eating five or more fruits and vegetables every day for better health. This program does not only benefit the seniors, but it benefits the farmers as well. Good nutrition is a critical factor in the health and wellbeing of senior citizens.

<u>There will be no in-person pick-up available this year at any</u>

location. We are required to complete all paperwork through the mail, email, or fax. Please use the form on the following page and submit to us. Once we have this form, we will mail you the SFMNP checks.

June 2020 FARMER'S MARKET

FMNP and SFMNP Basic Rules and Regulations

- FMNP checks cannot be used before June 1, 2020 or after November 30, 2020.
- FMNP customers may buy only the fruits and vegetables grown in Pennsylvania
- Recipients must sign in the "Signature Recipient or Proxy" block on the front of the checks. Do this before going to the market or take a pen with you.
- At the market look for stands displaying the white Farmers Market Nutrition Program poster.
- Each check is worth \$6. Farmers are not permitted to give change for purchases for less than \$6.
- Program recipients may place orders online with FMNP approved farmer; however, you must pay with your paper FMNP checks. A proxy may go to markets to make the purchase for you.

Market information

To find a farmer's market or farm stand with eligible farmers please download the FMNP app. The PA FMNP app is available in the Google Play store and the Apple Store for free. Search for PA FMNP farmers market locator and down load the app.

Or go to <u>www.pafmnp.org</u> to search our online farmers market and farm stand database.

For market with phone numbers please contact the market for changes to operating hours before visiting.

**** Note:** Program recipients are encouraged to practice social distancing and wear masks at markets and stands.

Got Medicare? Get a no-cost test for COVID-19

If you have Medicare and want to be tested for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID19), there is good news!

Medicare covers tests with no out-of-pocket costs. You can get tested in your home, doctor's office, a local pharmacy or hospital, a nursing home, or a drivethrough site. Medicare does not require a doctor's order for you to get tested.

Testing is particularly important for older people and nursing home residents, who are often among the most vulnerable to COVID-19. Widespread access to testing is a critical precursor to a safe, gradual reopening of States.

When a vaccine for COVID-19 is developed, Medicare will cover that, too.

For Medicare beneficiaries who are homebound and can't travel, Medicare will pay for a trained laboratory technician to come to your home or residential nursing home to collect a test sample. (This doesn't apply to people in a skilled nursing facility on a short-term stay under Medicare Part A, as the costs for this test, including sample collection, are already covered as part of the stay.)

If you receive Medicare home health services, your home health nurse can collect a sample during a visit. Nurses working for rural health clinics and federally qualified health clinics also can collect samples in beneficiaries' homes under certain conditions or you can go to a "parking lot" test site set up by a pharmacy, hospital, or other entity in your community.

Similar things are also happening in the Medicaid program, giving states flexibility to cover parking-lot tests as well as tests in beneficiaries' homes and other community settings.

The Families First Medicaid eligibility option has been implemented, which allows states to cover uninsured citizens' testing costs with no cost-sharing. Individuals should contact their state Medicaid agency to apply for this coverage. Both Medicare and Medicaid cover serology or antibody tests for COVID-19. These tests can help identify who has been exposed to the virus.

Medicare generally covers the entire cost of COVID-19 testing for beneficiaries with Original Medicare. If you're enrolled in a Medicare Advantage health plan,

your plan generally can't charge you cost-sharing (including deductibles, copayments, and coinsurance) for COVID-19 tests and the administration of such tests. In addition, Medicare Advantage plans may not impose prior authorization or other utilization management requirements on the COVID-19 test or specified COVID19 testing-related services for the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Private health issuers and employer group health plans are required to cover COVID-19 testing, and certain related items and services, with no cost-sharing during the pandemic. This includes items and services that result in an order for, or administration of, a COVID-19 diagnostic test in a variety of medical settings, including urgent care visits, emergency room visits, and in-person or telehealth visits to the doctor's office.
