Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings, will offer affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at Brockwayville Depot on Wednesday, December 7, 2022.

A package of four screenings to identify risk for stroke, heart disease and other chronic conditions will be offered for \$139.00:

Carotid Artery Screening (Plaque)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a serious medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.

PennDOT Phases in Newly-Designed Driver Licenses, Identification Cards

PennDOT announced it is updating the design, and enhancing the security features, of its driver licenses and identification cards.



The licenses and cards will look different, as seen in the photo to the left, and have additional enhanced security features that improve fraud prevention and protect holders from counterfeiting and alteration.

All driver and photo centers will transition to the new products by mid-November.

Advance Care Planning

Making health care decisions for yourself or someone who is no longer able to do so can be overwhelming. That's why it's important to get a clear idea about preferences and arrangements while you can make decisions and participate in legal and financial planning together.



Use this checklist to ensure health care and financial arrangements are in place before serious illness or a health care crisis.

Start discussions early with your loved one while everyone can still help make decisions.



Create documents that communicate health care, financial management, and end of life wishes for yourself and the people you care for, with legal advice as needed.



Review plans regularly, and update documents as circumstances change.



Put important papers in one place.

Make sure a trusted family member or friend knows the location and any instructions.



Make copies of health care directives to be placed in all medical files, including information on every doctor seen.



Give permission in advance for a doctor or lawyer to talk directly with a caregiver as needed.



Reduce anxiety about funeral and burial arrangements by planning ahead.
